

Dysart State High School - RTO Number: 30381 (under the delegation of QCAA).

Dysart State High School is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO), and as such can deliver a variety of courses containing formally recognised qualifications from the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF). The qualifications delivered by most Queensland secondary schools are at Certificate I and II levels, although some schools also offer Certificate III qualifications.

Dysart State High School also works in close partnership with other RTOs (TAFE and private providers) to access higher VET qualifications. These generally are the training component of School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SATs), but may also be attached to subjects offered through our normal curriculum offerings.

VET in Schools Funding - VETiS

Funding for external VET offerings has changed. This means careful consideration and planning needs to go into choosing externally (DSHS is NOT the RTO) offered courses. Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) focuses on delivering qualifications to provide students with the skills and knowledge required for specific industries.

- From 1 July 2014, the VET investment budget will only fund ONE (1) qualification (fee-free) in a skills shortage area for students enrolled in schools.
- If the qualification is NOT listed on the Queensland Training Subsidies list students are required to pay full fees (fee-for-service).

These changes do not affect:

- VET delivered and resourced by schools – DSHS is the RTO
- School-based apprenticeships and traineeships (SATs)

Why chose VET at Dysart State High School?

- VET can provide opportunities for all senior students: those seeking university entrance, those seeking employment-specific skills and those at risk of not completing their schooling.
- VET provides learning opportunities beyond the traditional curriculum.
- Assessment in VET meets industry standards.
- Having work-related skills makes students more employable.

How is VET offered at Dysart State High School?

VET Certificates

These Certificates can be achieved through subjects studied at Dysart State High School:

- SIT20213 - Certificate II in Hospitality

These certificates can be achieved through subjects studied through external partnerships with other RTOs:

- BSB20115 - Certificate II in Business (May be eligible for VETiS funding)
- MEM20413 - Certificate II in Engineering Pathways (May be eligible for VETiS funding)
- SIS20115 - Certificate II in Sport and Recreation (May be eligible for VETiS funding)
- School Based Apprenticeships or Traineeships

School-based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SATs)

SATs allow students to work for an employer and train towards a recognised qualification under contract of training while completing a program of school studies.

Students whose SAT is not completed by the time they finish Year 12 may convert to a full-time or part-time apprenticeship or traineeship

QCE Points:	4

They will be required to provide ingredients for weekly practical cooking lessons and practical cookery assessment tasks. Students may also be asked to pay for the cost of attaining their Responsible Service of Alcohol qualification which is generally around \$40.

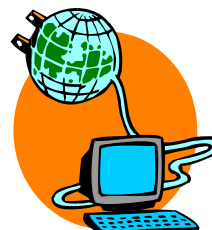
